MINUTES
October 4, 2022**

The meeting of the Council of the City of Westover, Alabama was held in the City Hall in Westover, Alabama at 6:30 p.m. on October 4, 2022.

Call To Order

Mayor Riggins called the meeting to order.

Roll Call – Clerk Meacham

Upon roll call, the Mayor declared a quorum present and the regular session opened for transaction of business.

Invocation

The invocation was given by Mayor Riggins.

Pledge of Allegiance

The Pledge was led by Mayor Riggins.

COMMUNICATIONS

Mayor Riggins announced a public hearing for a possible increase on the School Sales Tax will be held Tuesday, October 11, 2022 at 6:30 p.m. at Mt. Tabor Annex. Mayor Riggins hopes we will have people attend to give their input on what they would like to see happen. Mayor Riggins will give an overall summary of what we are looking to do and that it is preliminary at this point. Mayor Riggins and the Council believe it is imperative that we have citizens' input on how money is dispersed and dispensed in the schools. Those rules and formulations of how those recommendations are made and who makes up the Committee are yet to be determined. Mayor Riggins would like to get the Committee formed and asked the Council to take notes during the meeting to address at the end of the hearing.

The Mayor stated we need our citizens behind this and want to make sure it is understood that citizens are already paying these taxes in Chelsea when doing business in Chelsea. There are only two or three businesses it would affect in Westover.

Mayor Riggins asked Attorney William Justice to attend this meeting to answer any legal questions that arise. During this meeting, by recognition of the Chair, any of the Councilmembers may speak at any time. Councilmembers may ask questions and speak to the citizens and Mr. Justice. At the end of the public hearing Mayor Riggins will ask the Council members for their comments.

This will be an informal session and we will start brainstorming with input from our citizens on what they would like for this possible increase in School Sales Tax/Law Enforcement Sales Tax and what goes on with the money for the schools. Mayor Riggins hopes that our neighboring city will agree to tie in with us. He knows of two on the Chelsea Council that would like to see everyone in the district that is going to Chelsea Schools combine into a Citizens Group or Advisory Council, whatever it needs to be named. He does not know if that will happen, but would like to see it happen and if it does then our Westover group of citizens will have input on the Chelsea schools sales tax dollars spent.

Mayor Riggins announced the public hearing for a Temporary Suspension of Certain Business Licenses, Permits and Buildings for Mini Storage Buildings along the U.S. 280 frontage will be held Tuesday, October 18, 2022, at our regular Council meeting beginning at 6:30 p.m. at City Hall. This is advertised and hopefully we will have public input on this as well. Mayor Riggins suggested the Council take notes during the meeting and at the end of the meeting the Council will have an opportunity to ask questions and make comments.

Councilmember Wayne Jones asked, with the situation of the buildings, would we entertain a motion of doing a multi-level storage warehouse rather than a metal type or put in the back area like a four story. Mayor Riggins does not have a problem with it and thinks the spirit of the agreement with the 280 Overlay and the highway commercial with the intent was for the U.S. 280 frontage to be used for other than mini storages.

Councilmember Wayne Jones reported Mr. Eddleman attended the last Planning Commission meeting with a new revised drawing needing approval, that night, to move the potential school site to a different location in one of the villages. Mr. Eddleman still needs the school site approved by the Shelby County Board of Education and they agree to building a new school so it is still a preliminary process that Planning Commission approved. Then another plot will be presented to the Planning Commission.

Mayor Riggins announced the Planning Commission has a work session scheduled for Thursday, October 20, 2022 and will be working on the commercial districts of zoning.

Mayor Riggins stated that Mr. William Justice, Attorney will be attending our Public Hearing on October 11, 2022.

Board of Zoning – Chairman Joe Smith – Absent

A Board of Zoning work session will be held Thursday, October 13, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. at City Hall. The purpose of the work session is to get oriented into the process of zoning variance hearings. There is only one on the Board that has actually been in a hearing. If anyone can come out and support the Board that would be appreciated. Not much going on right now but with Chelsea Square having four or five permits and having a couple of lots where they are going to be building homes, there is a good chance that the Chelsea Square lots are going to need variances. Councilmember Roberta Stamp stated that Chelsea Square was subdivided before zoning and subdivision regs and each one has had to go through variance requests except the cul-de-sac lots because they are so big.

Westover Fire Department - Chief Micah Woodley – Absent

Mayor Riggins reported the Fire Department is almost finished outfitting & equipping the battalion vehicle and waiting on decals and camper top which will take approximately four to six weeks.

The framing has been finished in the back of the Fire Station and plans are to begin with the drywall this week and if so, they will be able to move things into the storage area. The Fire Department is doing the best they can with working going on inside.

OLD BUSINESS:

Mayor Riggins discussed in our pre-meeting a public hearing to discuss the Schools Sales Tax Increase will be held Tuesday, October 11, 2022 at 6:30 p.m. at Mt. Tabor Annex.

Mayor Riggins announced a public hearing to discuss Temporary Suspension of Certain Business Licenses, Permits and Buildings along the U.S. 280 frontage to be held Tuesday, October 18, 2022, at our regular council meeting beginning at 6:30 p.m. at City Hall. Mayor Riggins will display on the screen showing properties that are still vacant with the frontage and the depth of these properties. This Public Hearing has been posted on our Facebook page, website and at the normal locations.

NEW BUSINESS:

The 2023 Street Plan for Rebuild Alabama Revenues was discussed in our pre-meeting and will need to be specified where the funds are designated for 2023 and advertised on our city website. The expenses listed is Rosewood Drive (\$10,000.00), Cedar Hill Farm Road (\$8,000.00) scraping by the Shelby County and Library (\$2,000.00) drainage repair. Mayor Riggins does not know of another street repair at this time. There is \$31,000.00 in the Rebuild Alabama funds at this time after the listed repairs will have another \$20,000.00 for other street repairs if needed. These funds can only be used for street repairs or infrastructure.

A motion was made by Councilmember Roberta Stamp to approve the Rebuild Alabama designated revenues.

A second was made by Councilmember Wayne Jones.

The 2023 Street Plan for Rebuild Alabama Revenues was adopted unanimously.

Mayor Riggins presented the budgeted Maintenance Person position and salary along with a job description. The budgeted already approved salary is \$19,800.00 annually.

A motion was made by Councilmember Wayne Jones to approve a Maintenance Person position and duties for the City of Westover.

A second was made by Councilmember Annette Tyler.

The approval for the Maintenance Person position and duties for the City of Westover was approved unanimously.

Mayor Riggins asked the Council for a motion to approve a used vehicle purchase for the Building Inspector. The quote is for a 2018 F150 for \$26,234.00 which is in Carrollton, Georgia and if purchased the dealership will give a three month/3,000 miles warranty. If approved, the current F150 truck will be assigned to the Maintenance person and Mayor Riggins would like to pick up this newer truck and make a final decision after inspection of the vehicle on Thursday or Friday, this week.

A motion was made by Councilmember Dr. Crisman to authorize Mayor Riggins to represent the City of Westover to purchase the 2018 F150 vehicle for \$26,234.00 for the Building Inspector

and Mayor Riggins to make the final decision at the dealership after final inspection. If any problems at inspection of vehicle we will continue to search further.

A second was made by Councilmember Annette Tyler.

The approval to give Mayor Riggins authority to represent the City of Westover to purchase the 2018 F150 vehicle for the Building Inspector upon final inspection was approved unanimously.

Mayor Riggins would like to interview the applicants. Mayor Riggins would like to introduce the new Deputy at our next Westover Business Alliance meeting on Thursday, October 27, 2022.

Councilmember Dr. Crisman stated it is a good idea for the deputy to be close by if needed.

Mayor Riggins announced the first planning meeting for the Westover Christmas Parade will be held Thursday, October 6, 2022. The Christmas Parade will be held Saturday, December 10, 2022.

Mayor Riggins completely understands with the cost of living and what is going on with taxes. There is concern regarding tax increases and feels that has not been an advantage to the City since Chelsea increased their sales tax and does not think it is going to hinder us when a business wants to relocate here in Westover. Mayor will be more than happy to discuss tax abatement for a period of time and incentives to get the business in Westover and hopefully will offset any tax they may have and would like to have the opportunity to talk to some businesses before this Council term ends.
